## Note

The following summary Table, produced daily, provides traffic trend information derived from a small sample set of traffic counters located on the national road network.

The information below covers the morning period from 7am until 10am. The trend for car traffic from this period of the day generally correlates closely with the overall daily trend in car traffic at each location.

## **Introductory Remarks**

- > Traffic figures are measured from 7am to 10am so as to provide an early indicator each day.
- Weekly heavy goods vehicle traffic has remained largely stable and accordingly the daily figures provided are for cars only.
- The changes recorded day-to-day are not cumulative they compare only the current day's figures versus the same day in the previous week, the same day last year and with the same day prior to the introduction of Level 3 restrictions on 7<sup>th</sup> October (i.e. Wed 30<sup>th</sup> Sept to Tues 6<sup>th</sup> Oct).
- Countrywide Level 5 restrictions were in place from Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> October to Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> December and were reintroduced on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020.

## Daily Data for Wednesday 13th January

- In general, todays traffic volumes show a decrease compared with Wednesday 6th January and a significant decrease compared with those before the October Level 3 restrictions were put in place.
- Car traffic just south of the Northern Ireland Border on the N1 at Jonesboro shows a decrease of -11% compared with Wednesday 6th of January and -48% since the start of the October Level 3 restrictions.
- In the case of the non-motorway border counter sites, traffic volumes today show changes of between -13% and +11% as compared with Wednesday 6th January. The changes in car traffic volumes since the application of October Level 3 restrictions ranges from -46% on the N16 east of Manorhamilton to -34% on the N15 south of Lifford. It should be noted that traffic volumes at the N2, N3, N14, N15 and N16 counters are lower than at the motorway traffic counters and are likely to display wider fluctuations in traffic figures than other traffic counters
- Traffic volumes on the radial routes into Dublin, comparisons with Wednesday 6th January are as follows: -4% on the N7 at Citywest, -4% on the M1 at Swords to Airport, -4% on the M11 at Bray and -4% on the M4 at Celbridge-Maynooth. Comparisons with the same day prior to the start of the October Level 3 restrictions are as follows: -35% on the M1 at Swords to Airport, -46% on the M11 at Bray, -35% on the M4 at Celbridge-Maynooth and -37% on the N7 at Citywest.
- The M50 (N3 Navan Road to N4 Galway Road) shows a decrease of -5% compared with Wednesday 6th January and a -34% decrease as compared with pre-Level 3 traffic.
- In the case of the regional cities the changes in car traffic volumes this morning as compared with Wednesday 6th January are as follows: M9 Waterford -10%, N6 Bóthar na dTreabh Galway 0%, N40 Cork -4%, and M7 Limerick -1%. Comparisons with the same day prior to the start of the October Level 3 restriction are as follows: N6 Bóthar na dTreabh Galway -36%, N40 Cork -43%, M7 Limerick -43% and M9 Waterford -45%.
