



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Regional Spatial & Economic Strategy (RSES)

- Each Regional Assembly has to prepare a long-term (12 years) Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy (RSES) for the whole of their region;
- Strategic policy document to set out a vision for the strategic planning and economic development of the region to 2031
- Overarching purpose of the RSES is to support the implementation of the National Planning Framework (NPF) & Government Economic Policies;
- Sets the framework for local planning and economic development - but will require strategic choices at the regional level
- Adoption of the RSES is a Reserved Function which requires the approval of the members of the Assembly.




NPF Population and Employment targets: Southern Region

The projected level of population and jobs growth in the Eastern and Midland Regional Assembly area would be at least **matched by that of Northern and Western and Southern Regional Assembly areas combined**.

The population of the Southern Region will increase by between 350,000 and 375,000 people between now and 2040 resulting in a total regional population of people. almost 2 million

- This population increase would need to be supported by an **additional 220,000 people at work** in the Southern Region resulting in a total regional workforce of 880,000.
- **50% +** of Region's future growth would be accommodated in the cities of Cork, Limerick & Waterford



Role of Southern Region in NPF

- 3 City Regions 3 MASPS
 - Cork, Limerick, Waterford -
- Strong urban structure
- Strategic location and assets airports, ports and transport links – strong national specialisms, pharma, IT, tourism.
- Diverse rural offer from coast to coast.


Scope and Content of RSES

- An Integrated Spatial and Economic to support and implement the national policy objectives set out in the National Planning Framework
- Will focus on higher level policies
- Will focus on issues, areas and settlements of key regional importance





Metropolitan Area Strategic Plans (MASP's)

- 12 year strategic planning and investment framework;
- Identify the key change parameters i.e. population, employment, housing, retail, travel patterns and key renewal, development and amenity areas
- Identify the sequence of infrastructure prioritisation, delivery and co-ordination
- Deliver compact regeneration and growth

Investment:

4 x NDP Funds

- Government has approved four funds to support PI2040/NPF
- €4bn over 10 years intended as transformational place-making initiatives with considerable scope for match funding and leveraging
- Urban Regeneration and Development Fund (URDF) €2bn to 2027,
- Rural Regeneration and Development Fund €1bn to 2027, managed by the Department for Rural and Community Development
- disruptive technologies (DBEI) and
- climate change (DCCAE)



Monitoring & Reporting

- A Monitoring Committee will be established to monitor progress/implementation on a 2 yearly basis
- National Oversight & Audit Commission
- The RSES must be reviewed within 6 years of its adoption




